Going forward, Burke says the organization will need strong support and leadership to continue on the path to achieving the results the Lethbridge region needs in the areas of poverty relief, child and youth development and mental and physical well-being.

"We've made great strides in the last four years and we really want to keep that momentum going."

### Clean, dry footwear important year-round

During Alberta's first ever Toasty Toes Campaign in 2015, Lethbridge and Coaldale chiropractic offices collected a total of 1,202 pairs of socks for the area's homeless and in-need population.

Dr. Clarence Haitsma of Mountain Heights Chiropractic kept his collection going all winter and on March 8, delivered a donation of nearly 400 more pairs to United Way's office!

According to Alberta Human Services, there were 10,627 homeless individuals receiving housing and support from the Government of Alberta in 2014.

Many homeless individuals are at risk of foot injuries such as blisters, a lack of clean, dry footwear. Recovery Heights Chiropractic), Jeff Mclarty, Executive Director (United Way) from these types of injuries can be impeded by an inability to get adequate rest and not being able to afford to fill prescriptions for medication.

Access to clean, dry socks year-round is an important part of preventing foot injuries in the first place.


# Did you know?

In 2015, the event raised \$503.75 during the two-hour event. This year, the tips earned totaled \$643.50.


Kathy Hong, public relations coordinator for the Lethbridge Hurricanes says it's one of the more unique community events the team takes part in.




#### Homelessness is Only One Piece of My Puzzle
